1.	Welcome and actions from previous meeting The Chair welcomed participants and advised apologies.	
	The Minutes from the previous meeting (Meeting 5, 10 May 2022) were distributed inter-session and are considered to be final. Actions from Meeting 5 are addressed in the present meeting (Meeting 6) at Item 5. Draft Ambient Air Quality Goal Protocol (Condition E32).	
2.	Declaration of interests The Chair invited declarations of interest. None were put forward.	
3.	Update on air quality monitoring stations Peter Morrall provided an update on progress in relation to the air quality monitoring station (AQMS) sites, including a slide provided with the Minutes.	
	Peter advised that in relation to the Ausgrid site (previously identified as site C6a), Ausgrid had advised that they had agreed to a mobile phone tower being installed at the proposed location of the air quality monitoring station. As such, the site for the AQMS has been moved closer to Manning Street (and Springside Street), while remaining within the Ausgrid site. The new location has the benefit of being closer to homes, which was preferred by

	RIAQCCC participants, as well as further from the existing DPE monitoring station.	
4.	Project update An update on the status of the project was advised by Adrian Broger, who presented a slide deck including aerial photographs to illustrate the current state of works. These slides include images of the proposed design for the ventilation towers, with a link provided to Studio Chris Fox landscape architects (https://studiochrisfox.com/projects/rozelle-interchange) should further information be helpful. The slide deck will be placed online along with the AQCCC Minutes.	
	Community representatives queried the status of the Western Harbour Tunnel project and how this would impact truck movements and air quality in the local area, as well as how it would affect air quality monitoring. Robert Strong advised that work on Package 1 (Southern Tunnel Works) of the Western Harbour Tunnel project had already commenced. No change in impact was anticipated on the air quality in the area.	
	Kendall Banfield queried irrigation for the vegetated panels that are being placed around the ventilation towers. Adrian advised that piping was integrated into the panels to enable irrigation and vegetative growth in what will be relatively harsh conditions. Additional maintenance is able to be undertaken by accessing the panels in situ, as needed.	
5.	Draft Ambient Air Quality Goal Protocol (Condition E32) Adrian Broger provided an overview of the Draft Air Quality Goal Protocol, noting as follows:	
	 The Ambient Air Quality Goal Protocol is a condition of approval requirement (Condition E32) that will evaluate a potential measurement that exceeds the ambient air quality goals in Condition E6 of the Planning Approval. The protocol includes steps for notification of recordings that exceed the goals. Following initial consultation with the AQCCC and approval by DPE, the protocol will be applied by the WestConnex Operator following the commencement of operations. The WestConnex M4-M5 Link Tunnels share the same conditions of approval as the Rozelle Interchange (RI) and have already developed a similar protocol for the operational phase of their project. As the requirements are the same for RI and M4-M5 Link, their protocol has been used as a template. The protocol also mirrors previously approved versions currently used on other operational motorways. An overall objective across these protocols is to provide consistency for the Community and WestConnex as the tunnel operator, once the tunnel is operational. 	
	Community representatives queried why the email template at Table 4 of the Draft document did not address the <u>duration</u> of an exceedance. Matthew Callander advised that the email was a high-level alert only, but that duration was required to be noted in detailed independent reporting that would be undertaken following an exceedance event. 	Adrian Broger confirmed that Condition E33 required duration of any exceedance to be investigated. He undertook to review the Draft to ensure this matter is clear prior to submission to DPE for approval.	that it is clear that the <u>duration</u> of any exceedance event is recorded.
	The final, approved Ambient Air Quality Goal Protocol will be made available on the project website.

Should the document not be ready for review, an update on project progress will be provided later this year, either online or by email. The timing of this meeting or update will be advised by the Chair.	The Chair will email regarding a possible fifth meeting or email update later this year.
	Community representatives sought confirmation as to how long ambient air quality monitoring was required prior to the tunnel becoming operational. Verity confirmed that monitoring is required for a twelve (12) month period prior to operation commencing, being December 2023.






