Update on air quality monitoring stations.

The WestConnex team provided a presentation, advising:

- There had been 1 complaint since the last meeting relating to rubbish within the fenced area of the Quirk Street ambient air quality monitor and the sound blanket requiring attention.
- Air quality data for each of the four monitoring stations showed there
 had been no air quality exceedances recorded since the last AQCCC
 meeting.
- That the issue which caused the Iron Cove Link Ventilation Outlet to miss ventilation data after a weather event in April, leading to a penalty notice from the EPA, has now been resolved and drainage improvements made by the D&C contractor to prevent it recurring.
- Ongoing operation and maintenance initiatives have recently included
 - Testing and maintenance across the more than 7,000 Fire & Life Safety system elements present in the Rozelle Interchange.
 - Safety improvements made to lane delineation assets allowing better visibility for drivers at the Anzac Bridge to M4 portal.
 - Relative Accuracy Testing Audit (RATA) of the 3 ventilation outlets.

The chair invited any questions from Community members and, referencing recent media coverage of silica dust exposure on construction of Sydney Metro tunnels, it was asked whether construction of the Rozelle Interchange presented any associated risk to the community.

The WestConnex team advised that silica would be found in deep excavation, with any airborne material put through specialised scrubbers before exiting tunnel works. Dust seen by the community would generally be surface works related.

4.0 Other business

The Chair advised members that proposed dates for 2025 meetings would be provided following the meeting.

The Chair offered the opportunity to raise any other air quality related business. Community members raised the deteriorated state of the vertical planting cladding on the Rozelle Interchange ventilation, requesting an update on the appointment of new contractors, as the issue had also been raised at previous meetings.

The WestConnex team advised they were still looking to appoint a new contractor to remediate and maintain this planting and that a staged approach was planned for commencement after the summer. This timing was questioned by members and the planting's status as an important part of the project approval was emphasised. Members requested a more detailed update on this issue.

The Chair agreed that it was a reasonable matter for the Committee's attention and requested WestConnex to provide a more detailed update at the next meeting.
